



EXAMPLE OF THE ORGANIZATION OF A GERMAN SUPPORTING POINTwhich it is endeavoured to conceal until required for use.

The original work executed is an approach trench, the dug-out, with camouflaged entrances, the wire fences, and the shell holes for dumps of tools. During the defensive battle, the garrison completes the supporting point by the addition of trenches as shown.

Wavy line Trench only dug by the garrison during the defensive battle.

Solid line Trench dug previously.
